I wish to call your attention to Sec 8. of the West End bill reported yesterday. I thought to meet with a prompt and vigorous protest from our City Council. No independent State Commission can be so well qualified to decide as to the proper use of our streets ~~as well~~ as our local authorities and the City Council ought to endeavor to preserve our Exclusive Control of our own streets either as to locating or revoking the location of railway tracks. This power if any ought to be near the people who are to be affected. If it is to be adopted it certainly should be provided that all pending cases shall not be affected by its adoption. Yours respy
