An Ordinance Relating to the Salary of the Board of Assessors.

Be it Ordained by the City
Council of the City of Cambridge
as follows

Sect. 1. The salary of the Board of
Assessors shall be one thousand dollars
per annum payable semiannually;
which shall be in full for all services
pertaining to said office

Sect 2. So much of an Ordinance
establishing the salaries of certain
City Officers passed May 18th 1852 as
relates to the salary of the Board
of Assessors, is hereby repealed
