The Joint Committee appointed by order of the City Council April 12, 1847, to inquire and report what further Ordinances, if any, are now required, also to inquire and report what amendments, if any, are necessary in those already adopted; and to whom was referred the Petition of A. B. Magoun and others, that an ordinance may be passed to restraining the going at large of Dogs; having attended to the duties assigned them and leave respectfully to Report, the accompanying Ordinances, the titles of which are as follows; viz: -

1. An Ordinance, for the suppression of disturbance on the Lords day.
2. An Ordinance, restraining the going at large of Dogs within the City of Cambridge.
3. An Ordinance establishing the salaries of the ~~City Messengers~~ Certain City Officers -
4. An Ordinance, in addition to "An Ordinance establishing a system of accountability in the expenditures of the City".
5. An Ordinance in addition to "An Ordinance prescribing the duties of Weighers of Hay and other Articles".
