WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Avon Hill Street, so-called, extending from Lincoln street northwesterly

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

forty feet in width between *Lincoln street* and a point about 100 feet northwest of *Foxcroft street, so-called,*

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *W.A. Mason & Son, Surveyors, dated Nov. 11. 1882*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, *the* several owners and abutters having agreed in writing to waive the usual notice of such taking.

I, the Undersigned, owner of land on Arm Hill Street, so called, Extending from Linnean Street Northwestern in the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts hereby waive notice of the intention of the City Council to lay out said street as a public way, and with the understanding that said street has for its westerly boundary a line already indicated by the pie stone monuments now set on the Easterly boundary of my Estate, and that said street from Linnean Street to Foxcroft Street is to be of the uniform width of forty (40) feet, Assent to such laying out, and agree to claim no damages therefor.
