WHEREAS: This holiday celebrates the moral and social leadership of a man who through the power of non-violence led millions of Americans in bringing the evil of segregation to its knees; and helped guide our nation from the shadows of hatred into the fine light of love; and

WHEREAS: The spirit of community service by which Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. lived should be a model for every human being who would advance the cause of justice; and

WHEREAS: Each year, the Cambridge Public Library holds an Annual Birthday Commemoration of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., thereby paying tribute to the principle of selfless dedication to the public good embodied by that greatest of leaders of men and women, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and

WHEREAS: This year marks the twenty first such commemoration sponsored by the Cambridge Public Library, prophetically pre-dating the institution of the national Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday; and

WHEREAS: At this twenty first Annual Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration, in addition to the traditional wreath laying, there will be an uplifting musical presentation by the Voices of Hope, an address by Patricia Smith, noted columnist for the Boston Globe, and a poet, playwright, and performer as well; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council joins the Cambridge Public Library on this day, January 8, 1995, in honoring the memories of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and be it further

RESOLVED: That all Cambridge residents are encouraged to support the 21st Annual Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration to be held on Sunday, January 16, 1994, and to uphold the spirit of community service by which Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. lived.
