WHEREAS: Residents have called attention to a serious safety concern on Franklin Street between Putnam Avenue and Bay Street where, following completion of new water pipe installation during last Fall, ruts and holes continue to break up the road surface. While the DPW has agreed to fill the holes temporarily, apparently there is some disagreement as to whether the temporary repair and the permanent repair through repaving the entire road surface is within the jurisdiction of DPW or the Water Department. In addition, note has been made that personal safety may be at risk due to the quality of installation of the new brick on the sidewalks in the same area; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager request clarification on jurisdiction in this matter from DPW and the Water Department; ascertain when the complete repaving of Franklin Street will be carried out and completed, and assure that, until that time, the ruts and holes will be monitored and filled in as required; that the brickwork on the sidewalks be given close examination for safety assurance; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the Council on the above within two weeks.
