WHEREAS: The current ordinance in Cambridge restricting the "storage" or parking of cars on city streets for more than 72 hours, seems to contradict the goals of our Vehicle Trip Reduction Program in that it is an inconvenience and dis-incentive to those residents who commute and shop by foot or on public transportation; and

WHEREAS: Many of these people feel that if they have to move their car, they might as well use it to get to places they could get to on foot or by the T; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Environmental Department and the Department of Traffic and Parking and report about whether ticketing for "storage" runs contrary to the goals of our Trip Reduction Policy.
