- WHEREAS: On August 2, 2000, the Cambridge Fire Department responded to an alarm of fire at 22 Dudley Street in North Cambridge where the Officer of Engine Four reported a kitchen fire in apartment # 42 ; and
- WHEREAS: A woman occupant, Jane Lindhorst was attempting to extinguish a grease fire in a pan, the back wall and kitchen cabinets were already scorched by the flames and Mrs. Lindhorst was suffering from burns to her hand and wrist; and
- WHEREAS: Courtney and Ashley Lindhorst immediately left the apartment, alerted neighbors and went to separate houses to call the fire department; and
- WHEREAS: Courtney and Ashley Lindhorst are eleven year old twin sisters and members of the fifth grade class at the Hegarty School in Cambridge and the daughters of Jane and Wade Lindhorst; and
- WHEREAS: The S.A.F.E. Program at the Hegarty School administered by the Cambridge Fire Department educates children about fire safety; and
- WHEREAS: The S.A.F.E. program is credited with providing these children with the knowledge needed to avoid a possible tragedy; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council praise Courtney and Ashley Lindhorst for their quick thinking and heroic actions and congratulate them on their receipt of the Young Heroes Award, scheduled to be presented at a State House ceremony on April 26, 2001; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Courtney and Ashley Lindhorst on behalf of the entire City Council.
