WHEREAS:

The City Council has received from His Honor the Mayor official notice of the death of Ex-Alderman Arthur R. Henderson, a highly respected citizen of Cambridge for many years.

Mr. Henderson came to Cambridge in 1870 at the age of seven years and resided here until 1922 - a period of over fifty years - during which time he showed an active interest in public affairs. In July 1883 he was appointed a clerk in the Boston Post Office where he received steady advancement, due to his application to duty and honesty of purpose, and on June 1, 1897 was made Assistant Postmaster of Boston. He resigned from the government service in 1900 to enter the real estate business in Harvard Square. He served as a member of the Board of Aldermen in 1906 and 1907. He was a success in the business world, a leader in community affairs and a representative citizen of the City of Cambridge.

It is therefore

RESOLVED:

That the City Council recognize the public loss sustained in the death of Arthur R. Henderson and desire to place upon record its tribute of respect to his memory. And it is further

RESOLVED:

That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the family of the deceased.

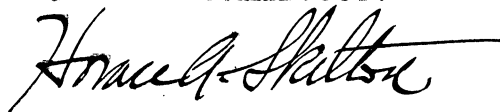
