- WHEREAS: On October 2, 2000 and beyond, students, families, members of religious groups, community-based organizations and other concerned citizens will continue to work together as activists to recognize and work for common sense solutions to confront gun violence in their communities; and
- WHEREAS: As ten young Americans are cut down each day by gunfire, protecting our youth must be our family's, community's and nation's foremost priority; and
- WHEREAS: This commitment must begin at the local level – where grassroots support can affect people on a personal level and encourage them to take an aggressive stand against gun violence; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City council does hereby proclaim October 2, 2000 as

FIRST MONDAY IN CAMBRIDGE

And urge all citizens to support this day through their involvement in a First Monday event and by dedicating themselves to protecting our children from gun violence through a campaign of grassroots action and education from this day forward; and be it further

- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to The Alliance for Justice on behalf of the entire City Council.
