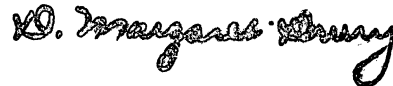


- WHEREAS: Anthony loved music; he played the drums and played in a band all of his life. Anthony was also a huge New York Yankees fan; and

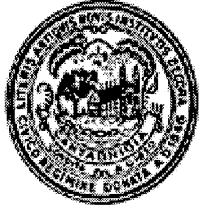

WHEREAS: Anthony "Tony" F. Arruda was born on Hurley Street in East Cambridge on June 11, 1926; and

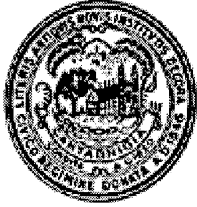
WHEREAS: Mary T. Fitzgerald was born in Cambridge on November 25, 1928; and
