The Boston and Albany Railroad Company by the use of its Grand Junction Branch have frequently obstructed travel on Cambridge Street, a public way in the City of Cambridge, unnecessarily and unreasonably, with its cars and engines, and

WHEREAS:

Such frequent obstructions on this public way causes great inconvenience and delay to travellers using said Cambridge Street, be it

ORDERED:

That the Chief of Police be and hereby is requested to see that the provisions of Section 151, Chapter 160 of the General Laws, governing the obstruction, use or occupation of public ways by railroad corporations be strictly enforced and, in the event of the failure of any railroad corporation to observe the law, that proper legal action be taken against such offending corporation.
