

# City of Cambridge.

In Common Council, February 2, 1875.

Whereas, the City often becomes the purchaser of estates at a sale for the nonpayment of Taxes and Assessments, and whereas it is necessary for the proper and convenient manner of keeping the accounts, that the amount of said Taxes or Assessments, with the costs, should be paid to the Treasurer, to enable him to settle his account of collections, in pursuance of the Warrants.

Ordered, That the Committee on Ordinances be and hereby is directed to consider the propriety of providing by Ordinance, that whenever the City becomes the purchaser of any estate at any sale for the nonpayment of any Tax or Assessment, the Mayor shall draw his draft in favor of the City Treasurer for the amount of such Tax or Assessment and costs.
