Dear Sir:

On Thursday, October 9, 1975, Miss Dorothy Singleton of 94 Crawford Street, Dorchester, Mass., came to the Detail Office with a Police Approval For Entertainment License form, for a dance to be held at 192 River Street, Cambridge on Friday and Saturday, October 10, 11, 1975.

I informed Miss Singleton that I could not approve a dance to be held at this location unless she had a clearance from the Cambridge Building Department and the Cambridge Fire Department.

The main entrance of this building is on River Street with a rear exit on Kelly Road. It is a three story brick building with a store on the first floor and family dwellings on the second and third floors. Nine families reside there. The store is very small and would not accomodate many people. The building is owned by Mr. Chiccarelli of Belmont, Mass.

Request for a dance at this location was disapproved by me and the Cambridge License Board [Miss Phyliss McLaughlin] was notified of said disapproval.

The request for a dance on October 10, 11, 1975 was the only time that anyone appeared before me for an Approval For Entertainment License for 192 River Street, Cambridge.


I have no knowledge of a party or dance being held at said location on or before October 11, 12, 1975.

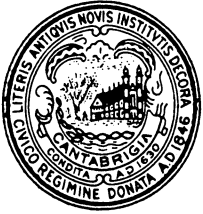
Recommendation for future procedure:

Before the License Board sends an applicant with a Police Approval for Entertainment License form to the Police Department, the License Board should inform that person that he should obtain a clearance from the Cambridge Building Department and the Cambridge Fire Department, if such clearance is necessary.

It should be mandatory that a police detail be assigned. Thus the officer will be able to protect the safety of the guests and ensure the peace and privacy of the neighbors.


