

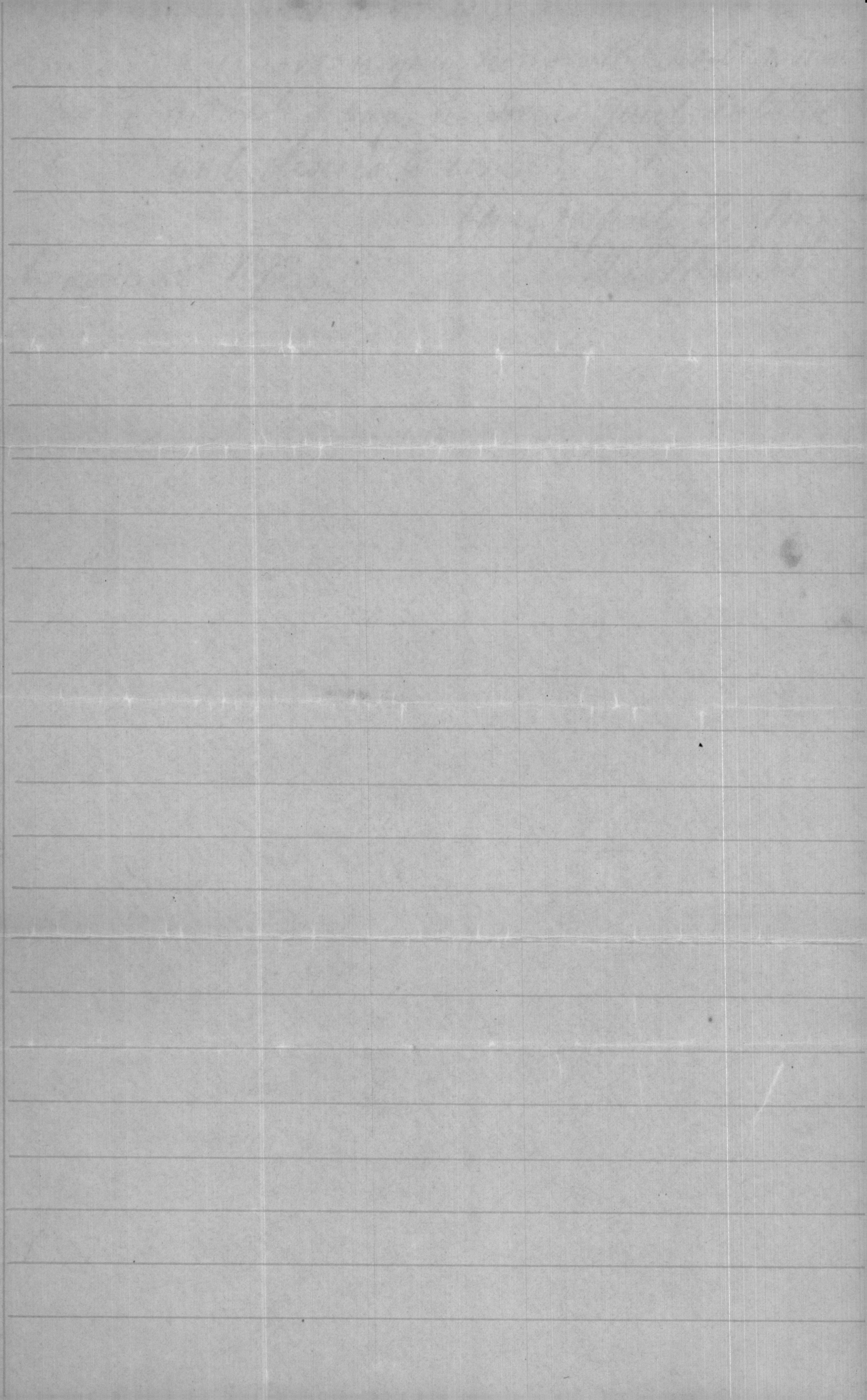
To the
