Members of the neighborhood have tried unsuccessfully through various city departments to have these vehicles removed from the Berkshire Street lot, now therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct whatever departments necessary to have these trucks removed at once and make provisions to prohibit the re-occurrence of this problem.
