Florence Cawthorne Ladd, Hon. AIA
Director
The Bunting Institute of Radcliffe College

Since 1989, Florence C. Ladd has been Director of the Mary Ingraham Bunting Institute of Radcliffe College. Prior to returning to Harvard/Radcliffe, she was Associate Executive Director of Oxfam America. She also served as a consultant to the Institute of International Education's South African Education Program.

With a B.S. degree in psychology from Howard University and Ph.D. from the University of Rochester, she has taught at Simmons College, Robert College and the American College for Girls in Istanbul, the Harvard Graduate School of Education and the Harvard Graduate School of Design. She was Associate Dean of MIT's School of Architecture and Planning and then was Dean of Students at Wellesley College. She has held fellowships at the Bunting Institute of Radcliffe College and the W.E.B. DuBois Institute at Harvard.

Ladd has published widely on housing and urban environmental issues including the book *Different Strokes*. More recently, her writings have focused on peace and international development. She is the author of the novel, *Sarah's Psalm*, published by Scribner in July 1996.

Ladd is a trustee of the National Council for Research on Women, Bentley College, Hampshire College and Boston's Institute of Contemporary Art; and she is an overseer of the Museum of Fine Arts Boston and WGBH. In 1995, she was awarded an honorary doctorate in humane letters by Simmons College. As an honorary member of the American Institute of Architects, she participates in the NEA-sponsored mayors' institutes on urban design.
