- WHEREAS: Members of the private sector are playing a major role in helping the "We've Got a Job to Do Campaign get off to a flying start; and
- WHEREAS: This project is an excellent example of the benefits of public-private collaboration; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council express its appreciation for the efforts of all those involved, including Saphira Baker, the Coordinator of the Youth Employment Office, and Susan Golden of CCS, and Mike Holmes of BayBank Harvard Trust; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge issue a call to all employers in the City to pitch in and contribute to this campaign, because even though times are hard, the young people of Cambridge will appreciate and benefit for their commitment of summer jobs.
