WHEREAS: Governor Weld has filed his version of the state budget, House One, with the Legislature; and

WHEREAS: It is imperative for the health and welfare of Cambridge and all local communities that the state budget contain adequate state aid to local communities; and

WHEREAS: It is of critical importance to Cambridge that the City receive meaningful cherry sheets setting forth projected local aid by March 1, 1995; and this can happen only if both the House and Senate adopt identical resolutions on local aid; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council urges Cambridge Representatives and Senators to call for an "Early Resolution on Local Aid" that includes at least the following minimum amounts;

- o \$51 million in unrestricted lottery aid; this amounts meets the Legislature's pledge to phase out the lottery cap over a five year period and return all of the expected growth in the lottery; this minimum requires rejection of the Governor's proposal that \$12 million be set aside to pay for the local implementation of the crime bill;
- o \$195.9 million in direct education aid to meet the Commonwealth's commitment to fund the education reform bill; and
- o \$477 million in the Additional Assistance Line item; and be it further

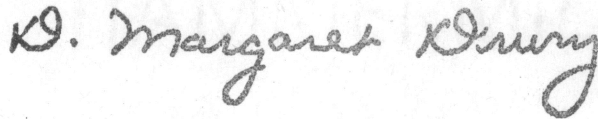
