To the City Council, the Human Services Subcommittee, and the City Manager

We, the undersigned, present this petition to the City Council Subcommittee on Human Services, Honorable Kenneth E. Reeves, Chairperson, with the hope that the City will hear and heed the requests of the residents of the City whose signatures appear hereon.

We request a public hearing before the Human Services Subcommittee as soon as possible in order to present arguments in support of budget increases for our Community Schools.

WHEREAS, Community Schools are the single, largest provider of afterschool supervised activities for children in the City of Cambridge; and WHEREAS Community Schools have not received an increase in their operating budgets in over 30 years; and whereas the City employees managing the Community Schools (Community School Program Directors) have not had a raise in over 20 years; and WHEREAS Community Schools operate under constraints of limited space and resources for their programs, **WE, THEREFORE**, petition the City, through the Human Services Subcommittee, to increase operating budgets for Community Schools in proportion to increases allocated to similar City agencies, to increase the salaries of the Community School staff to be equal to other City employees performing similar responsibilities; to allocate funds for additional staff to assist the overburdened Community School Program Directors; to provide monies for office equipment, hardware and software and other necessary office supplies to bring the administration of Community Schools at least into the 20th century; and to consider the other needs of Community Schools described in previous communications with the City Council and City Administration.

The Citywide Community Council made a presentation with the introduction given by Carolyn Shipley, Chair.

Carolyn Shipley stated that this meeting came about because a petition was presented to the City Council requesting a public meeting regarding budget increases for the Community Schools Program. She presented petitions containing 900 signatures to the committee requesting that the Community Schools Budget be reviewed which is attached to the this report as **Attachment A**. She explained the functions and the needs of Community Schools to the committee (**Attachment B**). Several flyers were displayed to the committee containing information on the various programs.

Peg Callahan, Tobin Neighborhood Council Member, 47 Blanchard Road, stated that thirty years ago she joined Community Schools. She stated that the bus trips are important to the elderly population of the city, but that they are expensive.

Charles Rogers, Longfellow Neighborhood Council Member, 27 Lee Street, Apt. 2, stated that neighborhood life is meeting, knowing and recognizing your neighbors and living in a neighborhood. He informed the committee that he learned to play the piano through the Community Schools Program. He stated that in the 1980's the neighborhood council recognized the area parks as an important neighborhood amenity. He requested support for the Community Schools Program.

Mayor Galluccio stated his support for Community Schools. Former Mayor Francis H. Duehay, he said, took great pride in the Community Schools Program. He understood the frustration that a new program, such as extended day with enhanced resources and enthusiasm causes to an established program. This program, he said, deals with youngsters, preteens, teens and seniors. Community Schools came first and he hopes the same attention is given to Community Schools as to other programs. The educational, recreational, programmatic and commitment of Community Schools is an important mix in the community, he said. He stated that Carolyn Shipley is a thirty year success story and that the same \$5,000 allotment in program funds that was provided thirty years ago is provided today.

Barbara Hayes, Maynard Neighborhood Council Chair, 143 Prospect Street, stated that there is a need to increase the \$5,000 to provide programs. Community Schools would like to bring back programs that had to be terminated because they cost too much for the existing budget, she said.

Joseph Braga, Harrington Neighborhood Member, outlined the salary structure of an Extended Day Program Manager and a Youth Center Director comparing them to the Community School Program Director as contained in

Attachment C. In conclusion, he said, quality is retained with compensation. He asked why is there a major delta in compatible positions in the city.

Decia Goodwin, Graham and Parks Community Council, 175 Chestnut Street, spoke on the duties of the Community Schools Director. The Director, she said, hires staff, coordinates activities for the before and after school program, early release days and special program events such as the trip to the Flower Show on Evacuation Day, a school holiday. The position has more responsibility with Human Services Department. She informed the committee that there is no additional personnel to take up the slack if the Director is sick. She requested additional budgetary consideration.

Marie Crowley, Fitzgerald Neighborhood Council Chair, 55 Rindge Avenue, stated that the Community Schools takes up seven pages in the **Resource Guide**. She stated she is the mother of a daughter and a son and her family participates in the Community Schools Programs at a fee her family can afford. The neighborhood councils are an important part of the community, she said. She further stated that the Extended Day Program takes up the Senior Program space.

Councillor Braude stated that his children go the Cambridgeport School and they have received pleasure from the Community Schools Program. The staff in the program is considerate, diverse and wonderful, he said. He stated that he is embarrassed for the city on its commitment to the program. He stated his support for the Community Schools Program.

Carolyn Shipley stated that the Community Schools Program has been treated like a "step-child." The Program, she said, has had the same budget for thirty years. After twenty-five years the W2 of the Program Director listed a salary of less than \$31,000. The Extended Day Program, she said, gets money because there is federal money available. Community Schools employees were not offered excess computers by the city, she said.

The presentation ended at six o'clock and fifty-five minutes p. m.

Councillor Sullivan opened the meeting to the public.

Jim Bass, 35 Seven Pines Avenue, listed his support for the Community Schools Program.

Charlo Maurer, 18 Laurel Street, informed the committee of the classes his two daughters participated in at the Community Schools Program. He supported the program.

Laurie Gross, Haggerty Program, 15 Ericsson Street, stated that the program encourages appreciation of the arts. More staff is needed, she said.

Rhea Karablas, 20 Alberta Terrace, stated that she is a single parent and relies on the affordability of the Community Schools Program. She stated that she is embarrassed about the salary of the Community Schools Director.

Martin O'Brien, 464 Windsor Street, stated that he supports the Community Schools Program. His daughter is a student at the Harrington School and attended the Cambridgeport Community School. He stated that schools around the country that have the highest scores are communities that have Community Schools.

Eileen Bacci, 149 Willow Street, a mother of ten children who used the Community Schools Program in the Harrington School stated that parents are happy that there is a Community School Program in their neighborhood because it is reasonable and flexible. She stated that she is happy that there is a new full time Coordinator at the Harrington School. She urged support of the Community Schools Program.

Diane MacLellan, 2 Olive Place, a mother of a seven-year-old daughter, stated that her child uses the Community Schools Program. She learned to play the piano and attended summer camp, she said. She urged the committee to support the Community Schools Program.

Uche Amaechi, stated that he is the coordinator at the Maynard School hired on January 15th. He stated that due to the physical presence of the Community Schools being located in the school he is able to work with the principal in the school. He stated that there should be more resources for the program.

Maria Freddura, 9 Tremont Street, stated that she is the mother of seven children. She stated that the Community Schools Programs have allowed her to give her children individual special attention. Each Community School has its own needs. She stated there is a need to show presence at the Fletcher School with the merger. The Danford Foundation, she said, has not brought all that was promised. The child is what is important. The Community Schools Program can remove all racial and economic barriers. There is no different level of standards in the Community Schools Program, she said. The salary, she said, should not be tied to education degrees. These candidates may be looking to go up the ladder and in the end not be there for the program. She urged the Community Schools Program stay under the Human Services umbrella and not the School Department.

Jackie Carroll, 36 Market Street, stated that she was the first Coordinator at the Roberts School. She is the mother of three children and the Community Schools Program was part of her children's lives. Doors were opened for her children through the enrichment program of the Community Schools, she said.

Neighborhood people run the program. There is not a lot that can be done with \$5,000, she said. The Community Schools Program has great staff – this staff has moved on because of the low salary.

Reva Stein, 2 Seagrave Road, stated that she has one son in the Community Schools Program and another son who will use the program shortly. She supports hiring quality staff and the purchase of equipment for the program. She further stated that it is important what her children do between the hours of 3-5 and the program is a good quality.

Drew Parkin, 15 Thingvalla Avenue, stated that he has two children who have utilized the Haggerty and Strawberry Hill Community Schools Program. He stated his endorsement of the Community Schools Program and the Senior Program. He stated that this program is a wonderful program that includes children with disabilities. He stated that there is no equity for children with special needs, the programs do not have the staff. The access for children with disabilities needs to be reviewed, he said.

Lucille Kelley informed the committee that 100 children participate in summer camp. The Community Schools Program can show four generations, which have come through the program.

Public comment was closed at seven o'clock and thirty-two minutes p. m.

Councillor Sullivan acknowledged the good work that the Community Schools Program does and its importance to the community. This good work, he said, brought people to this meeting on short notice. He apologized that the commitment to the program has not been sustained over the last five years. Councillor Sullivan stated that the City Manager made a commitment to look at some of the items requested by the Community Schools Program right away; some items will not make this budget cycle this year.

Councillor Born stated that the Community Schools Program is a gift. The Community Schools Program is the type of a program that other communities wish they had, she said. The salary and program money has not increased over the years and its time, she said. She did not like to see new programs pitted against old programs. She backed the Community Schools Program 100%.

Councillor Davis stated that she was a volunteer at the Community Schools. She met her husband through the Community Schools Program. Her sons participated in the program, she said. They attended summer camp at the Morse School. She stated that the salary structure is outrageously low. She wants to see the program adequately funded. If Cambridge is looking at what children are doing while parents are at work, the Community Schools model works, she said. All programs, however, are not equal. Maybe the program needs to focus on children and evaluation of the programs, she said.

Councillor Sullivan stated that it is a citywide program that holds no bounds for who can attend, therefore, the city should make it the best the city has to offer.

Councillor Decker thanked all that came to the meeting. She stated that she supports Community Schools. She values Community Schools because it brings the community together, she said.

Councillor Toomey stated that everyone should be treated fairly. He thanked people who were with this program when it began thirty years ago. He stated that it is an equity issue. The City Council needs to keep pressure on the City Manager to increase funds to this program, he said.

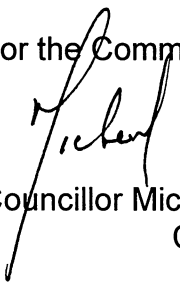
Vice Mayor Maher thanked the audience for their commitment to the Community Schools Program. He stated that the pay equity is a big issue. He further stated that validation is needed for good jobs done. This, he said, is not done for money alone. During his tenure on the School Committee he saw the importance that the Community Schools Program has on the community, he said. He urged what issues that can be rectified be rectified.

Councillor Sullivan thanked Jill Herold, Ellen Semonoff and Jim Maloney for attending the meeting. Their purpose, he said, was to listen to the community regarding this program. He informed the committee that a meeting will be scheduled with the City Manager, Ms. Herold and Mr. Maloney for next week to bring in the Community Schools Program for the FY01 Budget.

Ms. Shipley urged that all the points be reviewed, such as staffing, salary and publicity. The Community Schools Program needs this, she said. She further stated that the Extended Day Program received all that was requested in a matter of a month and no public hearing was required. She stated her desire to be involved in the budget process. In conclusion, she stated, SHOW ME THE MONEY!

At eight o'clock the meeting adjourned on motion of Vice Mayor Maher.

In City Council April 10, 2000

The Finance Committee, comprised of the entire membership of the City Council, conducted a public meeting on Tuesday, March 28, 2000 at five o'clock and forty-five minutes p. m. in the Sullivan Chamber.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Community Schools Budget.

Present at the meeting were: Councillor Michael Sullivan, Chair, Mayor Anthony Galluccio, Vice Mayor David Maher, Councillors Kathleen Born, Jim Braude, Henrietta Davis, Marjorie Decker and Timothy Toomey, James Maloney, Assistant City Manager for Fiscal Affairs, Jill Herold Assistant City Manager for Human Services, Ellen Semonoff, Deputy Director of Human Services, School Committee Members Alice Turkel and E. Denise Simmons and Donna P. Lopez, Deputy City Clerk.

Councillor Sullivan opened the meeting and stated that the City Council has received numerous e-mail messages in support of the Community Schools Program. He informed all present that City Manager Robert W. Healy was unable to attend the meeting due to a family commitment.

Councillor Sullivan requested Alice Turkel and E. Denise Simmons, School Committee Members, to come forward to address the committee first due to the fact they had to attend a School Committee meeting this evening.

Alice Turkel expressed her strong support for Community Schools. She stated that her family has benefited from the services of the Community Schools Program.

E. Denise Simmons, Vice Chair of the School Committee, stated she is a resident of Area 4 and that she wanted to testify as a Community Schools staff person as she had worked for Community Schools. She stated that there is a salary inequity between the Community Schools employees and School Department employees. Most Community School employees, she said, work and live in Cambridge. She stated that the Community Schools Program has family involvement, and the extended day program does not. Community Schools enables people to have input in their neighborhood. She urged the committee to support the Community Schools Program and listen to what are their needs.
