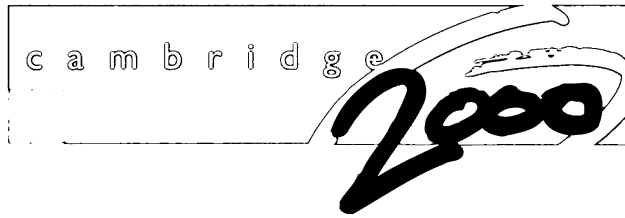

To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$320,000 to the Public Investment Fund Community Development Extraordinary Expenditures Account from the Southern Energy Kendall, LLC.

This appropriation represents a reimbursement to the City for consultants' fees and expenses to be incurred by the City for environmental engineering consulting and legal fees during the City's review of the proposed Kendall Station Equipment Upgrade Project. The project involves the expansion of the existing Kendall Square Power Station. The power station was formally owned and operated by ComEnergy, and has recently been purchased by Southern Energy. The City's consultants and attorneys will be attending hearings before the Massachusetts Energy Facility Siting Review Board in connection with Southern's application for site approval for the project. In addition, the City's consultants and attorneys will be reviewing and analyzing data submitted by Southern regarding the potential environmental impacts the project may have on the community, to ensure that Southern will provide the most beneficial amenities to the City in connection with the project.
