- WHEREAS: Clyde served during World War II in the United States Army in the European Theatre for three and a half years; and
- WHEREAS: Clyde received the Peabody Award for Radio Documentary; and the U.S. Department of State Meritorious Honor Award; and
- WHEREAS: Clyde was a graduate U.S. State Department's Senior Officers Seminar in 1965; and retired from the foreign service in 1980; and
- WHEREAS: Clyde's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Muriel; his sons Dustin, Patrick and Timothy Hess; his daughter Jennifer Hess; his four grandchildren; and
- WHEREAS: Clyde will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

HESS—Clyde G. Hess, Jr., 76, of Bedford, NH and Sarasota, FL, died November 13, 1999 at the Elliot Hospital in Manchester, NH following a brief illness. He was born in Watertown, MA on February 22, 1923, the son of Clyde G. and Grace (Dustin) Hess, Sr. He was a graduate of Newton High School and attended Cornell University and the University of Vermont, prior to enlistment in the U.S. Army, where he served three and a half years in the European Theater. His first marriage, to Betty Ann Jones, ended in divorce. His second wife, Gladys Tomajan of Worcester, MA died in Baghdad, Iraq in 1955 of intestinal disease. He worked at WTAG and the Worcester Telegram Evening News and Gazette in Massachusetts where he received a Peabody Award Radio Documentary Division in 1951 and later another for VOAs coverage of the 1972 presidential elections. He spent two years in the Middle East on Ford Foundation Fellowships (1952-1954) and then joined the U.S. Information Agency, subsequently serving in Baghdad, Khartoum, New Delhi, Karachi, Saigon, Seoul and Ottawa. He received the U.S. Department of State Meritorious Honor Award (Vietnam) in 1968 and was a graduate of the U.S. State Department's Senior Officers Seminar in 1965. Following retirement from the Foreign Services in 1980, he was a consultant on media and public affairs to the Korean Embassy in Washington, DC from 1980 to 1988. At the time of his death, Mr. Hess was working on a study of the Puritans and religion in early America. Family members include his wife of 41 years, Muriel (Murray) Hess, three sons, Dustin Hess of Jacksonville, FL, Patrick Hess of Rye, NH and Timothy Hess of Orono, ME; a daughter, Jennifer Hess of Cambridge, MA; and four grandchildren. A memorial service will be conducted on Tuesday, November 16, 1999, at the First Congregational Church in Manchester, NH at 3:00 PM with the Rev., Dr. Frank Irvine officiating.
