

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, Sept. 6, 1865.

Whereas a Private Way, in Ward Five, called Wyeth Street, has heretofore been dedicated to the public use by the owners of adjoining lands, and is now in a fit condition to become a public highway, -

And Whereas it is adjudged by the Mayor and Aldermen that the public convenience and necessity require that said street be laid out as a public highway, and that no person will be damaged thereby, or be entitled to any compensation from the City, -

Therefore Ordered, That said private way be and hereby is laid out and established as a public highway, by the name of Wyeth Street, agreeably to a Plan thereof, drawn by W. A. Mason, Surveyor, bearing date of July, 1865, and now before this Board; to run from Brandon Street to Concord Avenue, the same to be thirty-five feet in width, as delineated on said Plan.
