Resolved, That public necessity and convenience require that Inman street, so-called, a private way extending from Broadway to Harvard street, should be laid out as a public street, and

Whereas, Due notice has been given of the intention of this Board to lay out said street as aforesaid, it is

Ordered: That a strip of land 37 feet in width included between the red lines as shown upon a plan on file in the office of the City Engineer, and dated March 25, 1872, be and hereby is taken for public use and laid out as a public street, and the grade thereof established as shown by the red lines on the profile of said street which is included in, and is a part of said plan.

Ordered: that damages be allowed for certain land taken on the west side of said Inman street, for the purpose of laying out the same, lying between the heretofore existing line thereof, shown in black on the aforesaid plan, and the line as established by this order.
