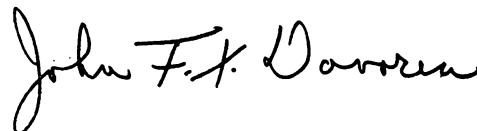

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

Subud Boston, Incorporated ✓

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

(a) To carry on and promote spiritual growth and, to further this purpose, to found and establish assemblies for the exercise and increase of spiritual development in accordance with the principles and practices of Susila Būdhi Dharma.

(b) To engage in educational, benevolent, and charitable work in conjunction with the study of spiritual development.

(c) The corporation is organized and shall be operated solely for spiritual or religious purposes and not for financial gain. No part of the assets of the corporation and no part of its activities shall relate to the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and any receipts of the corporation in excess of its expenses and debts shall be distributed (see 2a)

Purposes: (cont.)

to one or more organizations organized exclusively for religious, educational or charitable purposes. No part of such assets shall be distributed to any of its members.

In addition to the said specific and primary purposes the corporation shall have the following general purposes and powers:

(a) The corporation shall have all powers necessary to complete and promote its stated specific and primary purposes. In addition to those powers it shall have all powers granted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts pertaining to charitable corporations and it will specifically have the power to;

1. Print, publish, sell or otherwise distribute books, magazines and pamphlets.

2. Purchase, receive, take by grant, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, employ, use and otherwise deal in and with real or personal property or any interest therein, wherever situated;

3. Sell, convey, lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of or mortgage, pledge, encumber or create a security interest in all or any of its property, or any interest therein, wherever situated;

4. Purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, employ, sell, lend, lease, exchange, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, mortgage, pledge, use and otherwise deal in and with, bonds and other obligations, shares, or other securities or interests issued by others, whether engaged in similar or different business, governmental or other activities;

Purposes: (cont.)

5. Make contracts, give guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage, pledge or incumbrance or, or security interest in, all or any of its property or interest therein, wherever situated;
6. Lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested;
7. Do business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by these Articles of Organization and the Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in any jurisdiction within or without the United States;
8. Make donations, irrespective of corporate benefit, for the public welfare or for community fund, hospital, charitable, religious, educational, civic or similar purposes.

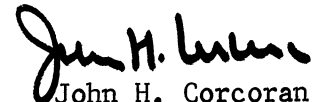
