That I, Walter J. Sullivan, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim the week of October 19, 1975 as Cambridge Bicycle Law Enforcement Week, and I urge all residents and visitors of Cambridge to join with the Police Department and Bicycle Commission to ensure the safety of all.
