

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight-Hundred and Sixty-two.

An Ordinance  
for the prevention of certain Nuisances.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

Sec. 1. No owner or person having the care of any sheep, swine, horses, mules, oxen, cows, or other grazing animals, shall permit or suffer the same to graze on any street, lane, alley, common, square, or other public place within the City.

Sec. 2. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of the preceding section, shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding twenty dollars.
