

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 16, 1863.

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public convenience and necessity require that Reservoir Street, from Vassal Lane to Fayerweather Street, should be laid out and established as a public highway,

Therefore Ordered, That said Reservoir Street be laid out and established as a public highway, from Vassal Lane to Fayerweather Street, the same to be fifty feet in width, as delineated on a Plan now before this Board.

And whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public convenience and necessity require that Fayerweather Street, from the intersection of Reservoir Street to Brattle Street, should be laid out and established as a public highway, and that the same should be widened on the Easterly side, between the Westerly line of the Estate belonging to the Heirs of the late William Wells, deceased, and Brattle Street.

Therefore Ordered, That said Fayerweather Street be laid out and established as a public highway, from the intersection of Reservoir Street to Brattle Street, the Westerly line of said Fayerweather Street to be the present Westerly line of said Street, as the same is delineated on a Plan of said Street now

before this Board, and the Easterly line of said Street to commence at the intersection of Fayerweather and Reservoir Streets, and to run in a Southerly direction, parallel with the above mentioned Westerly line, and at the distance of fifty feet therefrom, until it reaches a point three hundred and eight feet and ten inches from said Reservoir Street, as delineated on said Plan; thence said line turning at a right angle, to run Westerly two feet; thence, turning at a right angle, to run Southerly parallel with said Westerly line, and at the distance of forty-eight feet therefrom, to said Brattle Street, so as to make said Fayerweather Street fifty feet in width where it is represented as of that width on said Plan, and forty-eight feet in width where it is represented on said Plan as of the width of forty-four feet; thus taking from said Heirs of William Wells a strip of land four feet in width off the Westerly side of their estate, and laying out the same as a part of said Fayerweather Street and a public highway.

Ordered, That no damages be allowed to any person, or persons, for land taken for the purpose of laying out Reservoir Street and Fayerweather Street as aforesaid.

Ordered, That the Superintendent of Streets be directed to remove and raise the fence of the Heirs of William Wells upon the line established, as aforesaid, as the Easterly line of said Fayerweather Street.

and to remove and reset any trees which it may
be necessary to remove, in consequence of the above
mentioned widening of said street.
