To the Honorable Members of the
Cambridge City Council -

The residents and property owners of the Dana Park Section would like to give a few reasons why a branch library in that section would be objectionable from their point of view.

The number of parks in the city are very few now, and in a thickly settled city there is little if any chance that there will ever be an opportunity for more. Several property owners selected that spot to buy their homes as it was one of the few remaining open spaces left in that section of Cambridge. Those few parks certainly should be kept for the intentions for which they were established. Now when there is talk of crowding out even that breathing space and covering up the little green that is left, it is disappointing to the home lover, and if carried through will certainly result in some of these residents joining the great exodus to other towns, making it truly the "deserted village."

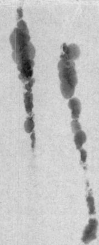

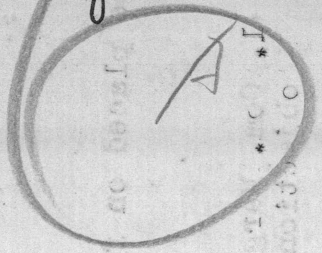
