WHEREAS: Much respected professionally as a Funeral Director in North Cambridge and personally as a quiet neighbor upon whom people could call and depend for assistance as needed, as a believer in preserving real family values long before the true meaning of the phrase "family values" was exploited and cheapened by many in our present culture, Kevin A. Griffin did the ordinary things in an extraordinary way, as was symbolized ultimately in the fact that he passed from the life we know surrounded by his family in the very bed in which he had been born in 1922. Such was the light of his life and its lesson as well; and

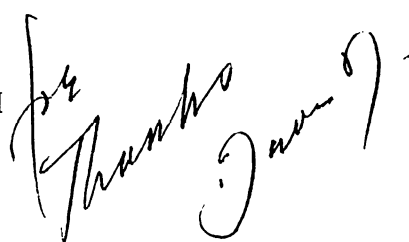
