WHEREAS: On February 19, from 7-9 p.m., the series will present the renowned documentary film on the Atlantic Slave Trade, "Dark Passages," followed by a discussion with the film's producer, Dr. Philip Hart, joined by Dr. Ronald Bailey; and

WHEREAS: This 60-minute film provides a detailed look at the tortuous slave voyages from the coasts of Africa to America; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council commend the Museum of Afro-American History, and the African Meeting House for its presentation of this important documentary, and for its entire Black History Month Sojourner Truth Lecture Series, and encourage Cambridge residents to attend and share in the knowledge and history.

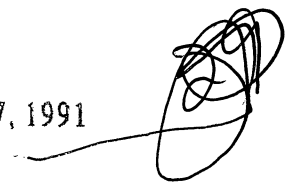
