CYSCA Awarded Community Connections Grant

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. - The Cambridge-Yerevan Sister City Association has received a new Community Connections grant to continue its professional development programs for professionals from Armenia. This grant, awarded by the US State Department Bureau for Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), is an extension of the previous grant which provided for three exchange programs over the past year, totaling 30 exchange participants. This new

award will provide for two additional groups over the next year.

Upon receipt of the award, Program Director Jack Medzorian said, "We're elated that our great past success has made an impression on the ECA. We're very grateful to the State Department that they did not only recognize our efforts but believe so fully in the progress we have made and what that progress implies for future efforts. We have seen great results

from our program alumni, and are convinced that we're on the right track in the focus of our efforts."

Under this new award, 10 Armenian businessmen will visit the Cambridge area in November for four weeks of professional development activity. Then in March, 10 educational administrators will visit the area on a similar program. During their stays, the participants will live with American host families in order to introduce them to the American cultural that they might not have the value of experiencing otherwise. CYSCA is recruiting host businesses, organizations and host families to share in this international humanitarian outreach.

CYSCA is a sister-city association created in 1987 by concerned citizens of Cambridge to promote world peace through grass-roots involvement and support.
