

City of Cambridge, In Board of Mayor and Aldermen
April 26th 1853.

Ordered That The joint Standing Committee on Ordinances consider the expediency of repealing Ordinance No 43, passed on the 13th day of May A. D. 1851, entitled "an ordinance in addition to an ordinance providing for the appointment, and prescribing the Duties of City Marshals, and establishing City Watch"; and of repealing Ordinance No 13 which was repealed by the aforesaid ordinance excepting so much thereof & such parts as relate to the appointment of two Deputy Marshals; and prescribing their duties.

Also to consider the expediency of repealing the Eleventh section of the Ordinance entitled "an ordinance, to prevent unlawful & injurious practices in the streets and other Public places in the city," passed on the 16th day of June A. D. 1846. and report at the next simultaneous meeting of the City Council.

Order concerning Repeal
of certain Ordinances

The joint standing committee on ordinances, to whom was referred the order of April 26th 1853, to consider the expediency of repealing ordinance No 43, entitled "an ordinance in addition to an ordinance providing for the appointment, and prescribing the duties of city marshal, and establishing a city watch; and of revising ordinance No 13, which was repealed by the aforesaid ordinance, excepting so much thereof, and such parts as relate to the appointment of two Deputy Marshalls; and prescribing their duties," have attended to that duty, and recommend, that said ordinance No 43, ought to be repealed.

Your committee having considered that portion of said order, relating to the expediency of revising ordinance No 13, establishing the office of city Marshal and prescribing his duties, are of opinion that the interest, dignity and welfare of the city require, a head of police, upon whom the Mayor may at all times rely, for a prompt and faithful discharge of the duties now required of the chief constables. The suggestions made by our present Mayor in his late address on this subject, are worthy of due consideration, and

meet the full approbation of your committee,
and as they are now published, and being dis-
tributed to the people, we ~~would~~ do not deem
it necessary to add any further remarks in
aid of the proposed measure, other than to
recommence the revival of said ordinance, with
certain amendments, and perfectly offer
the accompanying draft for the considera-
tion of the City Council.
