Dear Honorable City Councillors,

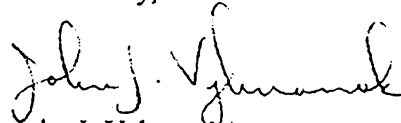
For your consideration at this evenings City Council meeting. Please save the Geese!

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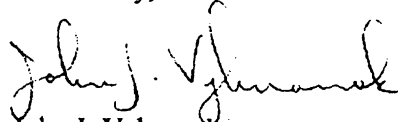
