WHEREAS:

On December 26, 1972, Detective Edward C. Hussey, Jr. and Detective John F. Conroy were patrolling the Harvard and Trowbridge Street area of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:

At approximately 9:00 P. M. both of these police officers observed a man cruising on Harvard Street attempting to draw a female into his motor vehicle, at which point these officers gave chase and continued to pursue this suspect, and

WHEREAS:

This pursuit involved not only Detectives Hussey and Conroy, but several uniformed officers as well, and

WHEREAS:

During this pursuit several gun shots were fired endangering lives of these officers from the suspect, and

WHEREAS:

The suspect, having been wounded in the exchange of gun fire, was apprehended as he attempted to hide under a car, and

WHEREAS:

Upon being arrested Detectives Hussey and Conroy determined that this individual was wanted in the Fall River area for various sexual offenses including rape, and

WHEREAS:

The subsequent investigation carried on by Detectives Hussey and Conroy lead to the indictment of this individual for two murders within our city, in addition to two murders in the City of Boston along with becoming a prime suspect in six other murders, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record congratulating Detectives Edward C. Hussey, Jr. and John J. Conroy for the outstanding police and investigative work which they did on behalf of the citizens of Cambridge, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That copies of this resolution be forwarded to both Detectives Hussey and Conroy in addition to Police Chief, James F. Reagan so that this resolution will be made a part of the permanent record of both of these police officers.
