WHEREAS: A delegation officially represented by the office of the Vice Mayor of Cambridge, the Cambridge Peace Commission, Congressman Capuano's office, Cambridge Rindge and Latin School students and teachers, and members of the Cambridge Sister City delegation will be traveling to El Salvador in April; and

WHEREAS: The delegation will meet with the schools, youth, the Municipal Council and the Mayor; and

WHEREAS: The delegation, which focuses on fair and free trade, will meet in the Capital with Dra. Beatrice de Carillo, the Attorney General of Human Rights in El Salvador; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record thanking the Dra. Beatrice de Carillo, the Attorney General of Human Rights in El Salvador for meeting with the delegation on their trip; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Dra. Beatrice de Carillo on behalf of the entire City Council.
