- WHEREAS: This City Council unanimously approved an Order on June 4, 2001 strongly supporting House Bill 4139 and Senate Bill 1870, legislation designed to allow Cities and Towns to continue to collect tax revenue from nonprofit organizations when such an organization makes a major purchase of property in a locality; and
- WHEREAS: The Joint Taxation Committee of the Great and General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts conducted a public hearing on this matter on June 5, 2001; and
