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# Rev. John L. Taglino

*Retired Cambridge pastor, at 86*

Rev. John L. Taglino, retired pastor of the Immaculate Conception Parish in Cambridge, died Sunday at the Milton Health Care Facility. He was 86.

Born in Somerville, he attended St. John's Seminary in Brighton and was ordained in 1940 in the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston.

He then served at St. Stephen's Parish in Boston, at St. Mary's Parish in Plymouth, at Sacred Heart Parish in Roslindale and at St. Anthony's of Padua Parish in Revere.

He was pastor at Our Lady of the Assumption Parish in East Boston and, beginning in 1985, at Immaculate Conception Parish in Cambridge.

Father Taglino is survived by a sister, Mary Ceruzzi of Arizona.

A funeral Mass will be said 11 a.m. Friday in Immaculate Conception Church in Cambridge.

Most Reverend Lawrence J. Riley, auxiliary bishop emeritus, will be the principal celebrant. Burial will be in Holyhood Cemetery in Brookline.
