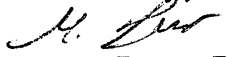

Subject City Council Order #8 of March 12, 1984 "Street Cleaning Signs"

The Traffic Department is investigating the possibility of revising the existing street cleaning signs with a view toward accentuating the day the street cleaning is done.

There are 5000 street cleaning signs now on our city streets and most of these are mounted with our Parking By Permit signs and they are both the type recommended and approved by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. To enlarge these signs would cost a great deal of money as new posts would be needed.

I am however looking at the feasibility of revising the existing sign by changing the color of the day of week from red to green thereby making that part of the sign stand out. This can be done by purchasing a strip with the day printed on it in green and placing it on to the existing sign. This could be done very easily and at a very low cost.

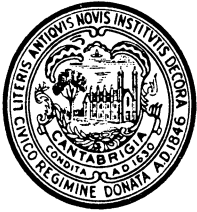
I am awaiting a cost estimate and will also install some test signs to evaluate them.
