

To the Mayor and Aldermen of the City
of Cambridge;

I am authorized to say that the City of
Cambridge is at full liberty to cause the
angle formed by the widening of Harvard
Street, against the College yard, to be relieved
by a slightly curved line, extending from the
angle to the Westerly end of the Stone wall, now
standing in front of the estate recently occupied
by Dr. Huntington; and that, if such change
should be made in the line of the sidewalk
of Harvard Street, no claim will be made,
by the College, for damages for the land taken.
