Report:-

The whole number of Streets in the City is	200
" " " " " with signs "	141
" " " " " without " "	139
" " " " " Signs "	220
" " " " " new signs required	
to place an average of two signs on each	
street where there is now no sign,	300
The cost of these, all up, at 90 cents each,	\$270.00
The number of posts required, where there are	
no buildings on which to place signs, is about - 500	
These posts, of five 12 inches square, and	
12 feet high, would cost, at \$2 each	\$1000.00
150 of the old signs need repainting, at	
an expense of 50 cents each, amounting to	\$75.00
The Committee would recommend the	
adoption of the accompanying Order.
