Urano Saragoni, 75, Hyannis restaurateur

Urano Saragoni, a leading chef and restaurateur, died of cancer Sunday in his Hyannis home. He was 75.

For 17 years, Mr. Saragoni operated "Chef Urano's" in Hyannis, a family-style Italian restaurant. It was enormously popular with locals as well as with entertainers and politicians whose pictures cover the restaurant's walls — from Sen. Edward M. Kennedy and his family to Perry Como, from newsman Tom Ellis to crooner Sergio Franchi, from Cape Cod and Boston businessmen to loyal regulars.

An Italian immigrant from the town of Lucca in Tuscany, Mr. Saragoni came to Boston at age 27. He began his career as a room service waiter at Boston's Ritz Carlton Hotel. He also worked at Locke-Ober and the Terrace Room at the Statler Hilton Hotel.

Mr. Saragoni was executive chef for the old Herald Traveler and WHDH-TV. During the 1970s, he became a regular visiting chef on the "Good Day" show on Channel 5 with host Janet Langhart.

In his white apron and chef's hat, Mr. Saragoni was

not only a fixture in his restaurant kitchen but also in his dining room, with its red-checkered tableclothes. He went from table to table spreading charm, hugging babies and their parents alike and sometimes even serenading them. Typically, it would be an aria from one of his beloved Italian operas.

Although a decade ago Mr. Saragoni lost his voice to cancer of the larynx, his boundless energy, combined with constant hand motions, always got his message across.

In 1954 Mr. Saragoni married the former Virginia Roche of Belmont and moved to Brighton. Mrs. Saragoni also died of cancer in 1977. She was 44.

Mr. Saragoni leaves two daughters, Janice Saragoni Bradlee of Cambridge and Sandra of Weymouth, and two grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated 9 a.m. Thursday at St. Luke's Parish, Belmont.

Burial will follow at Belmont Cemetery.
