- WHEREAS: This City Council was saddened upon learning of the death of William L. Galvin, a noted Cambridge Architect and long time member of the Board of Zoning Appeals; and
- WHEREAS: Bill graduated from Harvard University in 1924 and later the Harvard Architectural School, now the Harvard Graduate School of Design, remaining active for many years with the university through the Harvard Alumni Chorus, singing at many commencements; and
- WHEREAS: Bill maintained offices in Harvard Square for some fifty years and throughout his professional career served as a member of local, state and national architectural associations, serving six terms as President of the Harvard Square Business Association and as Chairman of the Board of Zoning Appeals for twenty-two years; and
- WHEREAS: Bill Galvin's advice on zoning and development matters was sought by people far and wide throughout his career, advice which will be greatly missed by all who knew him; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Julia (O'Keefe) Galvin and to the Galvin family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Galvin on behalf of the entire City Council.
