

City of Cambridge.

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In Board of Aldermen, March 24. 1858.

Ordered, Resolved, That the public necessity and convenience require that North Avenue be straightened between Spruce Street and the West-Cambridge line, and that the same be widened, upon one or both sides thereof, by taking private property for public use:—

Ordered, That the lines of North Avenue, between Spruce Street and the West-Cambridge line be straightened and established according to a Plan drawn by W. A. Mason & Co., dated November 1857, and adopted by this Board December 23, 1857, the red lines on said Plan denoting the true lines; and that said Avenue be widened, where requisite, by taking for this purpose, so much land as lies between the red lines on said Plan and the present-travelled way, and that the land so taken be established as a part of said North Avenue

and a public way.

Ordered, That damages occasioned to the owners of land hereby taken for public use, be estimated and awarded as follows; viz. — to the owners of the "Cook Estate", lying between the Avenue to the City Farm and West Cambridge line, the sum of Fifty-five Dollars: — to Annie C. Teed — the sum of Fifty Dollars.
