- WHEREAS:** Many Cambridge motorists are hard pressed to find legal and clear parking spaces, and
- WHEREAS:** This situation, through no fault of the Cambridge motorist or Public Works Department, has left many streets dangerously impassable, inaccessible to snow removal and emergency equipment, and
- WHEREAS:** Such conditions present serious safety hazards as well as dangerous driving conditions, damage to automobiles and short tempers, now therefore be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to develop a snow emergency program which utilizes the parking facilities of the School Department, and private firms, in addition to other usable open spaces for use by Cambridge residents during a snow emergency, thereby enabling the Public Works and Traffic Department to do a more complete and efficient job of snow removal while insuring safe and convenient parking areas for residents throughout the City, and that the City Manager report back in 2 weeks with recommendations.
