An Ordinance
Establishing the Salary of the City Marshal
of Cambridge.

Be it ordained by the City Council of
the City of Cambridge, as follows, —

Sec 1. There shall be paid to the City
Marshal of the City of Cambridge an
annual salary of Three thousand Dollars,
in equal quarterly payments of seven hundred
dollars each; which shall be in full
for services rendered in his official capacity.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect
from and after the first Monday in April
next.

Sec 3. all ordinances, and parts of ordinances,
inconsistent with the foregoing, are hereby
repealed.
