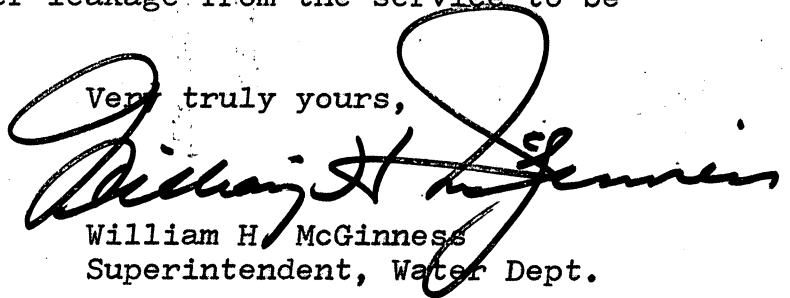
Subject Aberdeen Way

Kindly be advised that within the area as described as a proposed public way adjacent to Aberdeen Avenue to be known as Aberdeen Way, it is presently a fire supply approximately fifty-five years of age, a water meter and chamber not suitable for highway traffic, and an eight inch water service to the abandoned building on the adjacent property. The normal procedure would be for the owner to shut off, disconnect, abandon, and remove the meter and chamber to make the area safe from injury to persons or equipment and eliminate the possibility of liability from water leakage from the service to be abandoned.
