Barbara D. (Mullane) Cataldo, 63, of Concord, died Sunday, Dec. 8, 1996 in Concord from injuries sustained in an automobile accident.

She was the wife of Ralph S. Cataldo.

Born in Cambridge on Jan. 29, 1933, she was the daughter of the late William Mullane and Alice (Galvin) Mullane. She attended Cambridge Public Schools, graduated from Cambridge High and Latin in 1950 and later received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from Boston University in 1954.

Following her marriage to Mr. Cataldo in 1954, she became a resident of Holbrook for six years prior to moving to Concord in 1960.

Mrs. Cataldo retired in 1994 after 30 years of employment as a Music teacher in the K-8 school at Hanscom Air Force Base. Since her retirement she has served as a substitute teacher in the Concord Public Schools.

She was a long-time member of the Concord Band and also the Massachusetts and National Teachers Associations.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by two daughters, Linda M. Cataldo of Goffstown, N.H. and Laurie J. Cataldo of Germantown, Md., and a son Richard F. Cataldo of Boca Raton, Fla.
