That the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to notify and warn the voters of the Democratic and Republican Parties that a meeting of the voters of said parties will be held on Tuesday, April 25, 1972 at the voting places designated by the Election Commission, for the purpose of expressing their preference for the person to be nominated as the Presidential Candidate for the Democratic and Republican Parties; for the purpose of electing the following delegates; ten (10) delegates at large to the National Convention of the Republican Party, ten (10) alternate delegates at large to the National Convention of the Republican Party; twenty (20) delegates at large to the National Convention of the Democratic Party, twelve (12) alternate delegates at large to the National Convention of the Democratic Party; seven (7) district delegates to the National Convention of the Democratic Party from the Eighth Congressional District, four (4) alternate district delegates to the National Convention of the Democratic Party from the Eighth Congressional District; two (2) district delegates to the National Convention of the Republican Party from the Eighth Congressional District, two (2) alternate district delegates to the National Convention of the Republican Party from the Eighth Congressional District; two (2) district members of the State Committee (one man and one woman) for each political party from the Second Suffolk, Second Middlesex and Third Middlesex Senatorial Districts; fifteen (15) members of the Democratic City Committee from each ward in the city; thirty-five (35) members of the Republican City Committee from each ward in the city, and it is further
