Wellesley mourns slain boy

LITTLE BENJAMIN Harvey was buried in a Quaker ceremony in Wellesley yesterday, where some 300 family and friends sought to heal the wound left by the 6-year-old boy's tragic death.

Members of the Wellesley Friends Meeting led the services, calling for forgiveness and a better understanding of human frailties, such as the one that led to the boy's murder Sunday in the Wayland woods.

Benjamin's father, Robert Lee Harvey, is charged with his son's death. The 31-year-old Wellesley man, who was found standing over the boy's body Monday morning, turned the knife he allegedly used to slit his son's throat on himself when police closed in on him. He survived his injuries.

"It seems so incredible that something like that could hap-

pen to such a young boy who never hurt anyone," Wellesley Police Officer Frank Urbani said at the service. Urbani had befriended the cheerful, inquisitive boy during his frequent visits to the police station with his mother, Susan, who is the town's animal control officer.

"Rest in peace my little friend, until we meet again," Urbani concluded, choking back tears.

Urbani later comforted Mrs. Harvey at the graveside service at Woodlawn Cemetery. Standing before her son's small, pastel-colored casket, Urbani clutched her hand while she struggled to hold back tears.

After the service ended and the gathering dispersed, Urbani remained. Bending down on one knee, he placed his hand on the coffin and said a brief prayer.

Wellesley Friends Meeting member Frederic Corneel

told the mourners to take comfort in the message given by a priest in Nazi Germany after the execution of a schoolboy: "Let us pray for those being executed and let us pray for the executioner," he recounted.

Earlier, mourners filled every room in the the George F. Doherty Funeral Home. Several on-duty police officers stood in the few available spaces left in the hallway, listening as several people told how they knew Benjamin.

"I remember Benjamin coming to the police station. He was always very happy, always asking questions," Wellesley Police Chief John Fritts recalled.

The boy's presence was most strongly felt when the flutist played the simple, childish melodies of Benjamin's two favorite Sunday school songs. Many heads dropped with tear-filled eyes.

Nils Bejerot, 67, drug researcher

STOCKHOLM, Sweden — Nils Bejerot, an international authority on drugs in society, has died at the age of 67.

Bejerot, who died Tuesday, suffered apparently from tu-

berculosis for several months. His health deteriorated following two arson attempts on his home in Stockholm last summer, said Jonas Hertelius, an official at the Swedish Carnegie Institute, a private group headed by Bejerot that specialized in drug research.

No one was injured in the attacks, but Bejerot's large private library and documents were destroyed and he was disturbed by the incidents.

Bejerot wrote books on drug abuse and criminal policy.

He maintained that the West's drug problem was created by the permissive drug poli-

cies in the 1960s. He attacked anti-drug programs that he believed failed to force addicts to take responsibilities in society, lashing out at what he called "lenient psychologists."

Several governments sought his advice on drug issues. In 1974 he was called as an expert in U.S. Senate hearings about hashish and marijuana.

He lectured earlier this year in the Soviet Union on drugs. He was also a main speaker at an Atlanta seminar arranged by the Parent Institute for Drug Education.

Services will be held Dec. 10 in Stockholm.
